

About The Higgins Art Gallery and Museum, Bedford

We are a Bedford Borough Council cultural service that showcases wonderful and varied collections of fine and decorative arts and changing exhibitions drawn from the nationally significant collection of British watercolours, drawings and prints. Displays of archaeology, social history and ethnography demonstrate how Bedfordshire has developed over time. These collections inspire a programme of temporary exhibitions, active learning and events.

In our permanent collection spaces you can:

- tour the 1840s house built by the Higgins family next to their brewery. Uncover family stories and Cecil Higgins' collection of internationally important glass and ceramics
- explore the biggest collection of painted furniture created by William Burges, the leading Gothic Revival architect and designer of the 1800s
- admire the decorative artwork and techniques of the most influential designers from over four centuries including fine glassware, textiles, enamels and metalwork
- study the Edward Bawden archive, the collection of one of the most influential artists of his generation. Discover the work of this versatile artist in changing exhibitions
- uncover the geology of Bedfordshire and discover how people from the Stone Age to Medieval times lived in and shaped the landscape we see today
- follow the development of the local area through agriculture, engineering and the brickworks, airships at Cardington, the Second World War and technological advances
- enjoy changing displays about local people who have influenced the story of Bedfordshire
- take a glimpse into the world of The Collectors and cases of natural history, ethnographic and archaeological items from near and far.

EXHIBITIONS

Colour & Light

15 February – 2 November Wixamtree and Connections Gallery – Free Entry

Colour and Light explores the fascinating relationship between colour and light in art from the 18th century to the present day. The exhibition showcases a dazzling array of works from The Cecil Higgins Art Gallery Collection, including iconic pieces by JMW Turner, John Singer Sargent, Sonia Delaunay, Peter Blake and Paul Nash.

A highlight of the exhibition is 'Cecil and Kali', a vibrant work by Chila Kumari Singh Burman created during her residency at The Higgins in 2003. This unique piece incorporates her signature colourful "girly" accessories alongside objects from the museum's own education collection.

New Digital Artwork - Light & Colour

The exhibition features a specially commissioned artwork by artist Dr Alison Goodyear. This immersive digital experience, created in

collaboration with four Bedford community groups, is inspired by the works in the exhibition. It is presented as an animated film and in augmented reality, allowing visitors to engage with the exhibition in new and exciting ways.

Dr Mary O'Neill will consider the impact of travelling towards southern/eastern light on some of the artists in the exhibition. Artist/producer Dr Alison Goodyear will share her journey from working with paint to working with virtual reality painting software and hardware as well as her innovative approach to collaboration.

This relaxed and informal study day is perfect for anyone wanting to learn more about the exhibition and some of the artists included.





Bedford Car Club

Hotel, Bedford High Street. In 1914 the Bedford & District Motorcycle Club was formed and was meeting at The Lion Hotel. By the 1920s these two clubs had merged and became known as Bedford Motor Club. Members took part in competitions, trials, driving tests, gymkhanas, treasure hunts, dinner dances etc. In 1953 some members broke away to form Bedford Automobile Enthusiasts Club concentrating on the competition aspects. For three decades the two clubs in Bedford co-existed, but in the early 1980s united as Bedford Car Club, going on to great success in various forms of motorsport such as autotests and rallying. During the 2000s club motorsport declined and Bedford Car Club closed in 2023, donating their heritage trophies to The Higgins Bedford, which are shared with visitors in this display.

Bedfordshire Police: A history

Station at Kempston, visits by appointment only. The display at The Higgins will highlight objects and their stories collected over the decades.

Noel Carrington

Opening 15 November 2025 Wixamtree and Connections Gallery Free Entry

This exhibition, the first of its kind, will tell the story of unsung hero **Noel Carrington** (1895-1989).one of the most influential figures of the 20th Century in the commissioning, editing and publishing of children's picture books. Eric Ravilious' High Street.

Kathleen Hale's Orlando books, Mervyn Peake's Captain Slaughterboard, were all commissioned by Carrington. For these three alone Carrington merits attention, yet he also edited and commissioned the groundbreaking Puffin Picture Book series.

Curated by writer and publisher Joe Pearson (Design for Today), the exhibition will bring together well-known classics of children's publishing as well as Carrington's commissions by artists such as Eric Ravilious and Edward Bawden.

Stanny's Stus: Images of Bedford Physical Training College 6 November - 31 May 2026 Sir William Harpur Gallery – Free Entry

Known as 'Stanny's Stus' around town, the students and staff of Bedford Physical Training College were often keen photographers who extensively documented their lives after pioneer Margaret Stansfeld founded her all female college in Lansdowne Road, in 1903. Recent digitisation of the photographs reveals their day-to-day engagement with sport, leisure and teaching in Bedfordshire, providing us with a glimpse of women's social and sporting history. The digitised images

from the Bedford Physical Education Archive are being exhibited for the first time outside their usual home at the University of Bedfordshire.

General Access

The Higgins Bedford has step free access to all levels. Wheelchairs, mobility scooters, pushchairs and assistance dogs are all welcome.

Disabled Parking

Limited parking is available in front of the courtyard entrance to the museum and art gallery for visitors with limited mobility, Accessible Parking Permits or Blue Badges. The car park gate is kept shut so please contact us ahead of your visit or phone reception on 01234 718185 on your arrival so that the gate can be opened for you.

Wheelchair Users

There are two adult wheelchairs available to borrow, please contact us ahead of your visit if you would like to book one.

There are three wheelchair accessible toilets on the ground floor.

D/deaf and Hard of Hearing Visitors

Reception areas, meeting and activity rooms are equipped with induction loops, which correspond to the 'T' position on most hearing aids. A portable loop is available for use. The Higgins works with Access Bedford to provide BSL talks, tours and events.


